




"The next step in my artistic endeavors will be to combine my geodesic style with my more traditional style. This will be acomplished by creating the geodesics via sautering sterling silver "toothpicks" and glass casting. This process will also allow me to bring color into my work and to further integrate the use of natural crystals and minerals to help illuminate a synthesis of metaphysical and scientific ideas.

My newest work, 'MerKaBah', currently on display in New York at The Progressive Art Gallery at The Well at 85 Fifth Ave. is the first step I've taken towards this evolution of aesthetics."
